He served as educational chair of the Institute for Management and Leadership in Education; as codirector of a joint program with the Harvard Medical School to bring principles of adult learning to the reform of medical education; and as codirector of the Change Leadership Group, a program for the training of change leadership coaches for school and district leaders. He is also a co-founder of Minds at Work, LLC, a client-serving and coach-training group to support the professional development of senior leaders and their teams in public and private sectors throughout the world. The recipient of numerous honorary degrees and awards, his many years of research and writing on adult development have influenced the practice of coaching, psychotherapy, management, and leadership; and impacted the disciplines of psychology, education, theology, literary criticism, medicine, and political science.
